

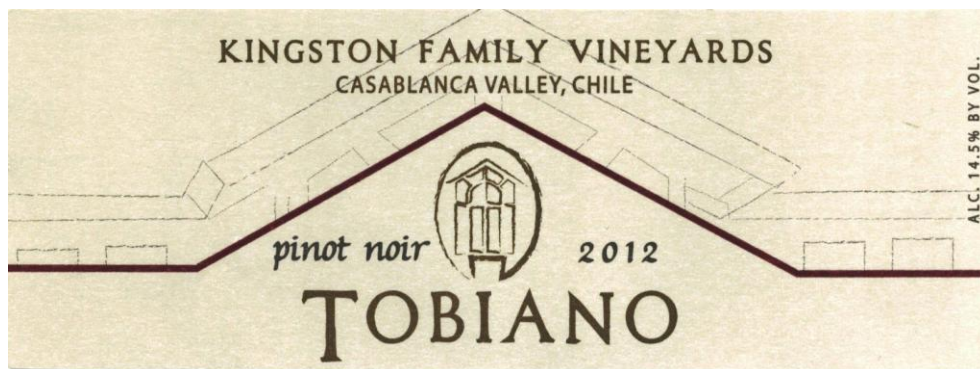

In the early 1900s, Carl John Kingston left his home in Michigan looking for gold in Chile. While he never found his mother lode, his search yielded a cattle ranch in Casablanca Valley, just 12 miles from the Pacific. Five generations later, his descendants are showing the same pioneering spirit. Instead of prospecting for gold, they're exploring new frontiers in Chilean winemaking.

- Several important critics have rated this Casablanca Valley wine highly: Wine Spectator gave the 2013 vintage a score of 90.
- Several vintages have been winning prizes in competitions: the 2011 vintage was awarded Bronze from the Decanter World Wine Awards, and the 2010 vintage was awarded Bronze from the International Wine Challenge.
- One of the most expensive red wines from Casablanca Valley (top 20%). The price has been stable over the past year.

In 2011, Kingston was named Winery of the Year by Wine & Spirits Magazine, and featured by the James Beard Foundation. Our wines have been embraced by many sommeliers and have found success in top restaurants, including Jardinière in San Francisco, Jean Georges in New York, and the Four Seasons in London.
