



Bodegas del Palacio Albariño de Fefiñanes

This is the oldest original Albariño producer. Their small, modern winery was custom-sized to fit into the ancient granite cloisters of their grand old Renaissance palace. Built in the first few years of the 17th Century, the building dominates the central square of Cambados - capital of the Salnés Valley - and is still in the hands of the original family.

Production Area: DO Rías Baixas- Galicia, Spain

Grape Variety: 100% Albariño

Vinification and Ageing: In the winery, the fruit is cold-macerated process for as long as 48 hours prior to fermentation. Partial malolactic fermentation is often used to soften acids, and the wines are sometimes given extended time on the lees with 'batonage' (stirring the dead yeast cells and other particles back into the fermenting wine).

Tasting Notes: Varietal aromas with many fine citrus and herbaceous. Full-bodied in the mouth, silky and very fresh, combining the harmony of flavors with elegance and dignity.

Pairing Notes: Albariño wines pair beautifully with fish and seafood.
