



Domaine Marsoif 2008 Epineuil Pinot Noir - from vines located in Epineuil, ten kilometers east of Chablis. New to the USA, Raphael Masson is an independent winemaker and produces 8 acres of AOC Wines, mostly Bourgogne Tonnerre Blanc Chardonnay, but now with some proper age on vines he planted, he has started to make Pinot Noir. Following sustainable farming methods, this small winery focuses on showcasing these noble varietals and bringing out the maximum of “terroir” expression. We are pleased to add his AOC Bourgogne Epineuil 2008 to the US market.

Details on Domaine Marsoif Pinot Noir AOC Bourgogne Epineuil 2008

Average age of the vines: 16 years

Location: Appellation Controlée Bourgogne Epineuil, southern facing hillside

Type of soil: large gravely stones and Kimmeridgien type clay soils (with little fossils much like those found in neighboring Chablis)

100% Pinot Noir

History and Accolades

This wine region has come back from the brink of extinction. Phylloxera crisis ravaged the vineyards (largely replaced by cereals) until the late 1900s.

Summer pruning of grapes to limit yields

Vinification

Grapes picked by hand between the 3rd and 13th of October

Cold maceration over 5.5 days followed by a slow fermentation. Malo finished in March.
